ST. HILARY OF POITIERS (Jan 13th)
Pray for us.

"No matter how sinful one may have been, if he has devotion to Mary, it is impossible that he be lost." St. Hilary of Poitiers

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"Arise, Jerusalem, and look to the East and See, your children gathered from the rising to the setting of the Sun." (Baruch 5:5)

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The Almighty, all powerful came among us; as an ordinary infant, dependent and lying on the manger on Christmas Night, and up to then, we can say, only the Angels, Mary, Joseph, and the Shepherds knew of his Presence among his People.

Epiphany marks that day of great joy, when the prophecy of Prophet Isaiah was fulfilled; "Nations shall come to your light, and Kings to the brightness of your dawn." This Day was in fulfillment to the promise made to Abraham by God; "I will make you a Father of a Great Nation and All the Nations of the Earth will be Blessed through You."

In the Gospel Reading, St Matthew the Evangelist, himself, a Jew, saw this day as the opening of the doors of Salvation to all Peoples, announcing, that the privilege exclusive to Israel was extended to the whole of humanity!

"Where is the Newborn King of the Jews?" The Magi asked. "We saw his star at its rising and have come to do Him homage."

These Kings are representative of the Gentile World in all its diversity; coming to Christ. Their coming to Jerusalem was not by chance; this was in the Plan of God, and was the Fulfillment of the Prophecy of Isaiah, in the 1st reading; "From Midian and Ephah; From Sheba shall come…they come bearing Gold and Frankincense, and proclaiming the Praises of the Lord." (Is 60:1-6)

Epiphany is the day of <u>Our First Calling</u> as Gentiles! Our pride is that these first Gentiles responded with great generosity; In a diligent search, making a Journey of Faith following the beckoning of the Star and they witnessed the generosity of the Love of God.

Matthew writes; "The star came and stopped where the Child was; and on entering the house they saw the Child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage;" Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts; Gold - signifying his Kingship, Incense- his Divinity and Myrrh - predicting his redemptive Suffering.

Matthew the Evangelist tells us that the Kings "were overwhelmed with Joy."

The Star had led them to Jesus. Notice, that it was not they, who discovered Jesus, but Jesus revealed Himself to them!

Their generous response and their journey led them to Him; <u>beginning the Great Procession that</u> continues to our day; "*The Humanity Pilgrimage to God Our Father through Christ Jesus our Savior!* This was in fulfillment of what we proclaim in the Psalm; "*Lord every Nation on Earth will adore You.*"

But notice the stark contrast, in attitude, between the Magi and the King and people in Jerusalem; I am surprised and shocked at the indifference and fear in Jerusalem!

These two parties asked the same question; "Where is the Newborn King of the Jews?" But with very different Responses! One led to an overwhelming joy for the Magi; the other led by King Herod, jealousy and fear of losing influence and power, led to the deaths of the innocent infants of Bethlehem.



COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

CHAPTER TWO

"From thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead"

135. How will Christ judge the living and the dead? 678-679, 681-682

Christ will judge with the power he has gained as the Redeemer of the world who came to bring salvation to all. The secrets of hearts will be brought to light as well as the conduct of each one toward God and toward his neighbor. Everyone, according to how he has lived, will either be filled with life or damned for eternity. In this way, "the fullness of Christ" (Ephesians 4:13) will come about in which "God will be all in all" (1 Corinthians 15:28).

CHAPTER THREE

I Believe in the Holy Spirit

136. What does the Church mean when she confesses: "I believe in the Holy Spirit"? 683-686

To believe in the Holy Spirit is to profess faith in the Third Person of the Most Holy Trinity who proceeds from the Father and the Son and "is worshipped and glorified with the Father and the Son". The Spirit is "sent into our hearts" (Galatians 4:6) so that we might receive new life as sons of God.

137. Why are the missions of the Son and the Holy Spirit inseparable? 687-690, 742-743

In the indivisible Trinity, the Son and the Spirit are distinct but inseparable. From the very beginning until the end of time, when the Father sends his Son, he also sends his Spirit who unites us to Christ in faith so that as adopted sons we can call God "Father" (Romans 8:15). The Spirit is invisible but we know him through his actions, when he reveals the Word to us and when he acts in the Church.

138. What are the names of the Holy Spirit? 691-693

"The Holy Spirit" is the proper name of the third Person of the Most Holy Trinity. Jesus also called him the Paraclete (Consoler or Advocate) and the Spirit of Truth. The New Testament also refers to him as the Spirit of Christ, of the Lord, of God - the Spirit of Glory and the Spirit of the Promise.

139. What symbols are used to represent the Holy Spirit? 694-701

There are many symbols of the Holy Spirit: living water which springs from the wounded Heart of Christ and which quenches the thirst of the baptized; anointing with oil, which is the sacramental sign of Confirmation; fire which transforms what it touches; the cloud, dark or luminous, in which the divine glory is revealed; the imposition of hands by which the Holy Spirit is given; the dove which descended on Christ at his baptism and remained with him.
