"The right time has come," he said, "and the Kingdom of God is near! Turn away from your sins and believe the Good News!" (Mark 1.15)

The Gospel reading, today, begins with John the Baptist exiting the scene. His Mission as the forerunner of Christ having being accomplished, with him pointing to Jesus as the long-waited Messiah; "Behold there is the Lamb of God."

In Today's Gospel, Jesus begins his Public Ministry, proclaiming "The Good News of God" as St. Mark the Evangelist narrates with these powerful words;" "The time is fulfilled, and Kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

"The time is fulfilled." After the fall of Adam and Eve, in the beginning of times, our first parents lost, not only the comfort and joys of the garden of Eden, but also the most important relationship; The Warm and Loving Relationship with God, their Creator. The book of Genesis tells us that God visited with them regularly, until the words, "I heard you in the Garden and I hid because I was naked." Our Parents denied themselves their worthiness of God, by giving in, to the deceit of the tempter; "You will certainly not die, you will be like gods."

But God would not leave it as that; He loved who and what He had Created! God immediately set in motion the plan to redeem us and creation! He begun the process to re-establish his relationship with us and Creation. The decision, however, of where and when this Messianic Era would be fulfilled, belonged to Him, and today you heard Jesus declare that the long wait had come to an end! God-directed opportune time was here!

"The Kingdom of God is at Hand." Asked by the Pharisees, when the Kingdom of God would come, Jesus answered; The Kingdom of God in not coming with signs to be observed nor will they say; "Lo here it is" or "there" for Behold the Kingdom of God is in the Midst of you." In another passage, Jesus accused, that, it was by the power of Beelzebub, the prince of the devils that he cast out demons, concluded in his response "And if it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the Kingdom of God has come upon you."

The Kingdom of God is in the Person of Christ Jesus. In him, "God's Lordship" became present among us! In Christ Jesus "the Rule of God" was understood anew; not with worldly powers does he rule, but through love that reaches to the end; the Sacrifice on the Cross.

"Repent and Believe in the Gospel!" These are two essential demands for becoming members in the Messianic Kingdom.

Faith, the prompt and complete abandoning of ourselves into the hands of God; An abandoning which allows us to grow in him as he reveals himself to us! You witness an example of this faith, in the immediate and unconditional response of the 1st disciples; Simon Peter and his brother Andrew, James and John the Sons of Zebedee. These 1st disciples Immediately left a secure and thriving industry in Galilee! They left their dad and hired servants and followed Christ.

The second demand of the Messianic Kingdom is a change in life. One of accepting and committing of oneself in a sincere return to God.

The story of the 1st Reading gives us an example of such a repentance in the people of Nineveh. This story goes further to reveal the central truth that is the foundation of all repentance; "The Mercy of God freely bestowed and unmerited." Jonah learned this, the hard way; God in His mercy, cannot be controlled or conditioned. He is free to grant it on whomever He wishes.

Brothers and Sisters, blessed in faith in this Kingdom of God, in this time of fulfillment, a people committed in sincere return to God, we are blessed indeed for we know Him, who is generous and free, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and rich in mercy.



COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

CHAPTER THREE I Believe in the Holy Spirit

145. What does the Spirit do in the Church? 733-741, 747

The Spirit builds, animates and sanctifies the Church. As the Spirit of Love, he restores to the baptized the divine likeness that was lost through sin and causes them to live in Christ the very life of the Holy Trinity. He sends them forth to bear witness to the Truth of Christ and he organizes them in their respective functions so that all might bear "the fruit of the Spirit" (Galatians 5:22).

146. How do Christ and his Spirit act in the hearts of the faithful? 738-741 Christ communicates his Spirit and the grace of God through the sacraments to all the members of the Church, who thus bear the fruits of the new life of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is also the Master of prayer.

The Church in the Plan of God

147. What does the word Church mean? 751-752, 777,804

The word Church refers to the people whom God calls and gathers together from every part of the earth. They form the assembly of those who through faith and Baptism have become children of God, members of Christ, and temples of the Holy Spirit.

148. Are there other names and images with which the Bible speaks about the Church? 753-757

In Sacred Scripture we find many images which bring out various complementary aspects of the mystery of the Church. The Old Testament favors those images that are bound to the people of God. The New Testament offers images that are linked to Christ as the Head of this people which is his Body. Other images are drawn from pastoral life (sheepfold, flock, sheep), from agriculture (field, olive grove, vineyard), from construction (dwelling place, stone, temple), and from family life (spouse, mother, family).

149. What is the origin and the fulfillment of the Church? 758-766, 778

The Church finds her origin and fulfillment in the eternal plan of God. She was prepared for in the Old Covenant with the election of Israel, the sign of the future gathering of all the nations. Founded by the words and actions of Jesus Christ, fulfilled by his redeeming death and Resurrection, the Church has been manifested as the mystery of salvation by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. She will be perfected in the glory of heaven as the assembly of all the redeemed of the earth.

-The Good News- Jesus the Son of God who died, was buried and was raised from the dead to save us from our sins and restore our relationship with God the Father.



Conversion of St. Paul (Jan 25th)

The conversion of Paul was a turning point in the history of the early Church. Saul, as Paul was first known, was a tentmaker from Tarsus who zealously persecuted the followers of Christ. While travelling on the road of Damascus, he was struck down amidst a blinding light from heaven. According to the accounts in Acts of the Apostles (9.1-22; 22.3-16; 26.12-18), a voice asked, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" Following the instructions, he was given, Saul headed into Damascus and began proclaiming Jesus. Threatened with death for his actions, Paul escaped the city by being lowered in a basket over the city wall.

Paul's zeal for the risen Jesus led him to become a passionate follower and later a teacher of the nations. The letters, or epistles, of Paul offer us a window into the early Church.
