"What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." (Mark 1.27)

In the 1st Reading today we hear Moses addressing the People of Israel who are almost in panic, for Moses was about to leave them. They were about to cross the River Jordan to the Promised Land and Moses had addressed them; "...I am one hundred and twenty years old, and can no longer act as leader. The Lord has told me," You shall not cross the Jordan." (Deut. 31:1-2)

What then? Who would lead them?

To the people, Moses was not only a leader who led them out of slavery in Egypt through the red sea and helped them form as a people on Mt. Horeb; <u>He was an intervener between them and God</u>; God's closest confidant and Friend. On Mt Sinai, when God revealed Himself in powerful theophanies, people scared pleaded with Moses; "Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord, Our God, nor see this great fire again or we shall die." The People of Israel were afraid of "a life without Moses," and he understood it!

In the Reading, Moses aware of the concerns of his people, diverts their focus to the One who was indispensable, The Lord God: It was He they were to trust! It was He who was their real and true leader. It is God who raises leaders for He is the one in control;

"A prophet like me will the Lord your God raise up from your kin, to him you will listen." The Lord God says; "I ... will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him."

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In the Gospel reading today Jesus is not only a Prophet with given authority; He "speaks on his own behalf!" Remember his teachings on the new standard in the kingdom of God;

"You have heard it was said you shall not kill (by God through the Prophet) ... but I say to you ... anyone who is angry with a brother will answer for it in court ... (Mt. 5: 20 & ff)

Jesus has that authority because of whom he is: The Son of God! There is no one who perceives his authority and the power of his presence than Satan who claims knowing who Jesus is;

"What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come here to destroy us? I know who you are the Holy One of God."

Jesus commands and the Devil obeys him because He is the Holy One of God. This is why we are in praise and in honor of Him; He is God among Us. Knowing the power and authority of Jesus, the question then is; why the unnecessary concerns?

St. Paul tells the Corinthians that "anxious concerns" are but a characteristic of unredeemed existence; rooted in a lack of confidence in Christ; God's Love. He recommends the best way of life as focusing our concerns to the Love of God.

May the Lord increase Our Love for Him. Amen.



COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

CHAPTER THREE

I Believe in the Holy Spirit

150. What is the mission of the Church? 781-802-804

The mission of the Church is to proclaim and establish the Kingdom of God begun by Jesus Christ among all peoples. The Church constitutes on earth the seed and beginning of this salvific Kingdom.

151. In what way is the Church a mystery? 770-773, 779

The Church is a mystery in as much as in her visible reality there is present and active a divine spiritual reality which can only be seen with the eyes of faith.

152. What does it mean to say that the Church is the universal sacrament of salvation? 774-776, 780

This means that she is the sign and instrument both of the reconciliation and communion of all of humanity with God and of the unity of the entire human race.

The Church: people of God, body of Christ, temple of the Spirit

153. Why is the Church the 'people of God'? 781, 802-804

The Church is the 'people of God' because it pleased God to sanctify and New SACRAMENTS save men not in isolation but by making them into one people gathered together by the unity of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

154. What are the characteristics of the people of God? 782-804

One becomes a member of this people through faith in Christ and Baptism. This people has for its origin God the Father; for its head Jesus Christ; for its hallmark the dignity and freedom of the sons of God; for its law the new commandment of love; for its mission to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world; and for its destiny the Kingdom of God, already begun

155. In what way does the people of God share in the three functions of Christ as Priest, Prophet and King? 783-786

The people of God participate in Christ's priestly office insofar as the baptized are consecrated by the Holy Spirit to offer spiritual sacrifices. They share in Christ's prophetic office when with a supernatural sense of faith they adhere unfailingly to that faith and deepen their understanding and witness to it. The people of God share in his kingly office by means of service, imitating Jesus Christ who as King of the universe made himself the servant of all, especially the poor and the suffering.

St. John Bosco (Jan 31st)

Known to many as Don Bosco, this patron saint of youth was born in Piedmont, Italy, in 1815. Raised in poverty, john was ordained in Turin in 1841. After witnessing the circumstances of boys living in a local prison, he resolved to devote himself to working among disadvantaged boys children living on the street, juvenile delinquents, and any child who was suffering because of disadvantage.

He formed the Salesian Society, named after Francis de Sales, and began educating boys of the poor and working classes, holding evening classes in factories, in fields or wherever there was a need. John believed in equipping boys for life in the world and trade schools soon formed a large part of Salesian training. A progressive thinker, he abhorred all punishment, believing that by removing youth from temptation, treating them with dignity and kindness, and enriching them with skills, they could be led to more productive lives. His rule was, "Not with blows, but with charity and gentleness must you draw these friends to the path of virtue." With the help of St. Mary Mazzarello, he also established the Salesian Sisters to do similar work among girls. John Bosco died in 1888 and was canonized in 1934.
