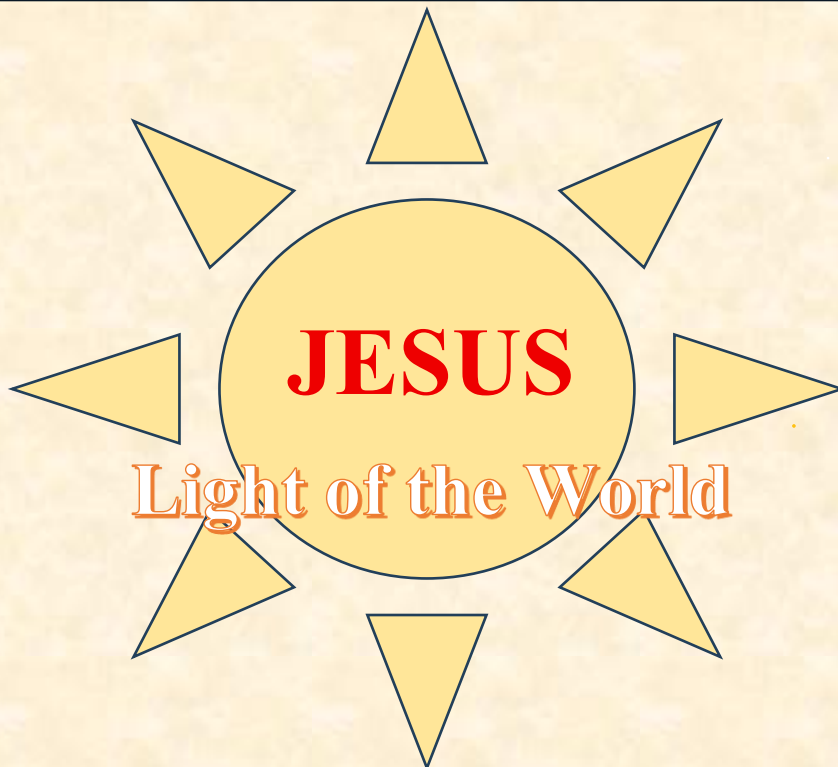

“I am the light of the world, says the Lord: whoever follows me will have the light of life.” John 8.12

Three Sundays ago, Jesus was presented to us by Mathew, beginning the Mission of his Father, with the proclamation; *“Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.”*

Jesus then set to lay the Foundation of the New Israel, with the call of the first four Apostles (Peter and Andrew, James, and John) and all heeded the call with an immediate response.

Last Sunday Jesus was presented to us as the “New Moses.” The New Law Giver, who unlike Moses who had received God’s Commandments on Mount Sinai, Jesus, God with us, gave the law himself; Revealing the will of God that brings fullness of Life in His Kingdom.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of God, Blessed are they who mourn for they shall be comforted, Blessed are the gentle, for they shall inherit the earth, Blessed are you who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied, Blessed are they who are merciful for they shall have mercy shown them. Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God. ...

Today, Jesus reveals the Mission or say the motivation of those who live the virtues listed in the beatitudes. You, the faithful disciple, *“are the salt of the earth!” “Are the Light of the World!” “Are a City set upon a Mountain!”*

By this, Jesus affirms, our significance in the World. We are indispensable, for without faithful disciples, the World is tasteless and dark! This is great responsibility, yet with it, Jesus elevates a disciple, to a honorable position. He elevates us into a position closer to himself, because as He said in St John’s Gospel; He, Himself is the true light of the World;

Jesus calls us to this noble mission; for a reason; ***“that others may see our good deeds and glorify your Father in Heaven!”*** And which are these “Good Deeds?” **Isaiah**, the Prophet, in the first reading today, reminds his fellow Jews, what God commanded them to practice; charity_towards their needy neighbors.

It’s only by doing this, that they could prove their love for God and expect God to respond in return;

“If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious talk, if you bestow your bread on the hungry, shelter for the homeless and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall break forth for you like the dawn! And you shall cry for help, and the Lord will answer: Here I am!”

God responds to our availability to him and our generosity to our neighbor, with the gift of his presence. Blessed are you, because you believe.



Catechism of the Catholic Church

Article 9

"I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY CATHOLIC CHURCH"

748. "Christ is the light of humanity; and it is, accordingly, the heart-felt desire of this sacred Council, being gathered together in the Holy Spirit, that, by proclaiming his Gospel to every creature, it may bring to all men that light of Christ which shines out visibly from the Church."¹³⁵ These words open the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church. By choosing this starting point, the Council demonstrates that the article of faith about the Church depends entirely on the articles concerning Christ Jesus. the Church has no other light than Christ's; according to a favorite image of the Church Fathers, the Church is like the moon, all its light reflected from the sun.

749. The article concerning the Church also depends entirely on the article about the Holy Spirit, which immediately precedes it. "Indeed, having shown that the Spirit is the source and giver of all holiness, we now confess that it is he who has endowed the Church with holiness."¹³⁶ The Church is, in a phrase used by the Fathers, the place "where the Spirit flourishes."¹³⁷

750. To believe that the Church is "holy" and "catholic," and that she is "one" and "apostolic" (as the Nicene Creed adds), is inseparable from belief in God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the Apostles' Creed we profess "one Holy Church" (Credo . . . Ecclesiam), and not to believe in the Church, so as not to confuse God with his works and to attribute clearly to God's goodness all the gifts he has bestowed on his Church.¹³⁸

St. Jerome Emiliani Feb 8th

Jerome was the founder of the Somascan Fathers and Brothers, also known as the Company of the Servants of the Poor. Jerome was born in Venice in 1486. Initially, he pursued a career in the military and gave very little thought of God. After a conversion experience, however, he gave all his possessions to the poor, became a priest, and devoted himself to the instruction of orphans and troubled youth, and the care of the poor. He founded an order, the Somascan Fathers, to help with this work. One of his acquaintances was Pietro Carafa, who later became Pope Paul IV. Jerome died on this day in 1537 of an illness contracted while tending the sick. He is a patron of orphans and abandoned children.
