"I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die!"." John 11:25

The 1st reading of today from the book of Prophet Ezekiel from his well-known prophecy the vision, of the "Scattered Dry Bones in the Plain." The people of Israel had made a Covenant with the Lord God but they abandoned God many times, and in the process sucked life out of themselves leaving themselves empty, dry and cold!

Nothing that they created for themselves could help them! Nobody, including their Kings could save them, but only He, who from the Beginning, breathed life into them; God their Creator and Father.

Ezekiel in this prophecy foretold a moment in time when God in His Son would intervene; gather his people together, and breath life away into these lifeless bones.

Today, in the Gospel reading, as Lazarus comes out of the tomb alive. Jesus fulfilled Ezekiel's Prophecy; He is "the life-giving-presence among his People."

The Rising of Lazarus as in every Miracle in St. John's Gospel has the purpose of revealing Jesus as the Son of God and Messiah.

These past Sundays, Jesus has been revealed to us as "the source of the living Water" in his encounter with the Samaritan Woman and last Sunday as the "Light of the World, with the healing of the Man Born Blind." The Samaritan Woman and the Man Born Blind were depicted as on a journey; A Journey of Faith.

Today, in the Sign of the Raising of Lazarus, the "disciple who is on this journey of Faith," is Martha; the sister to Lazarus.

When Martha heard that Jesus was on the way, she run out to meet him. Her first words were, "Lord if you had been here my brother would not have died ..." Here, Martha confessed Jesus just as a Miracle Worker; and acknowledged that Christ's earlier presence would have made a difference in her brother's life, but Jesus as the miracle worker was absent thus failed to save her brother.

Jesus responded to correct her misunderstanding and informs Martha that Lazarus will rise! Martha again fails to acknowledge the power of Resurrection in the Person of Jesus and rather schooled Jesus on the Jewish Traditional Teaching about resurrection - "Resurrection on the last day."

At this moment, Jesus took the initiative away from Martha; and centered the Resurrection on his person.

"I am the resurrection and the life;" "Whoever believes in me even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die!"

Jesus calls Martha to this Faith to which she Responded with a better understanding; "Yes Lord." "I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the One who is to come into the world!"

It is one thing for one to say, I believe but quite another to put that Faith into practice when reality demands. Martha, failed yet again when they came to the tomb; when Jesus requested the stone to be rolled away, she attempted to stop the action; "Lord he has been in the Tomb for four days!" "There is already a stench!

Jesus again had to wrestle the initiative from Martha; "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"

Adopting a position of prayer and lifting up his eyes to Heaven; Jesus prayed; expressing his gratitude and absolute trust in the communion with the Father, and then commanded Lazarus to come out ... And Lazarus walked out bound. Jesus then commanded them; "Untie him and let him go."

Scripture says; "*Many came to believe in Him.*" Likewise, Martha, as a disciple, saw and believed in Jesus as the resurrection and the Life. Martha had ascended from moments of "Partial Faith" to truly believing in Jesus as the Christ; the Son of God. Like Martha, we are all called to this Faith!

Next Sunday, with the Palm Sunday, we begin the final ascend with Jesus to Jerusalem to celebrate yet again, the Solemn Festivities of Our Salvation; Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection, let us pray, that we may be granted the Grace to Believe.



COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

CHAPTER THREE The Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic

The Faithful: hierarchy, laity, consecrated life

188. What is the vocation of the lay faithful? 897-900, 940

The lay faithful have as their own vocation to seek the Kingdom of God by illuminating and ordering temporal affairs according to the plan of God. They carry out in this way their call to holiness and to the apostolate, a call given to all the baptized.

189. How do the lay faithful participate in the priestly office of Christ? 901-903

They participate in it especially in the Eucharist by offering as a spiritual sacrifice "acceptable to God through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 2:5) their own lives with all of their works, their prayers, their apostolic undertakings, their family life, their daily work and hardships borne with patience and even their consolations of spirit and body. In this way, even the laity, dedicated to Christ and consecrated by the Holy Spirit, offer to God the world itself.

190. How does the laity participate in the prophetic office? 904-907, 942 They participate in it by welcoming evermore in faith the Word of Christ and proclaiming it to the world by the witness of their lives, their words, their evangelizing action, and by catechesis. This evangelizing action acquires a particular efficacy because it is accomplished in the ordinary circumstances of the world.

191. How do they participate in the kingly office? 908-913, 943

The laity participate in the kingly function of Christ because they have received from him the power to overcome sin in themselves and in the world by self-denial and the holiness of their lives. They exercise various ministries at the service of the community and they imbue temporal activities and the institutions of society with moral values.

192. What is the consecrated life? 914-916, 944

The consecrated life is a state of life recognized by the Church. It is a free response to a special call from Christ by which those consecrated give themselves completely to God and strive for the perfection of charity moved by the Holy Spirit. This consecration is characterized by the practice of the evangelical counsels.

193. What can the consecrated life give to the mission of the Church? 913-933, 945

The consecrated life participates in the mission of the Church by means of a complete dedication to Christ and to one's brothers and sisters witnessing to the hope of the heavenly Kingdom.

PENANCE

Penance (poenitentia) designates (I) a virtue; (2) a sacrament of the New Law; (3) a canonical punishment inflicted according to the earlier discipline of the Church; (4) a work of satisfaction enjoined upon the recipient of the sacrament

These have as their common center the truth that he who sins must repent and as far as possible make reparation to Divine justice. Repentance, i.e., heartfelt sorrow with the firm purpose of sinning no more, is thus the prime condition on which depends the value of whatever the sinner may do or suffer by way of expiation.
