# "As the Father loves me, so I also Love you. Remain in my Love." John 15:9

The Gospel reading is a continuation of that which we read last Sunday, when Jesus used the image of the vine and its branches to describe the intimate relationship between us, himself and God, the Father.

Just in a plant, the same *plant sap*, flows from the *roots* to *the branches*, making the plant achieve its goal i.e. *bearing of Fruits* so does the same life-giving Spirit flow in Christ and in us, making it inevitable that we are to bear fruits.

Today the Gospel is on the command to Love. Jesus urges us to abide in his Love and to Love one another; "As the Father loves me, so I also Love you. Remain in my Love."

The Father loves the Son with an infinite love. And as the Father love Jesus so does Christ love for his disciples in an infinite way. Yes, to a point of laying his life for them.

This Love of Christ invites us to a new relationship; A relationship where He and God the Father, have taken the initiative; "You did not choose me, I Chose You" "No one can come to me unless drawn to me by the Father;"

In this relationship the disciple is not a servant; slave; dependent on a Master! We are friends, equal associates of Jesus!

This Love is indispensable! Christ repeat this command "Love one another," twice.

St. John in the second reading, tells us the reason as to why we should love;

Love is our true nature! In the Genesis when God created us, as it is written, "*in the Image of Himself He created them, male and female He created them,*" created us in the Image of Love.

If therefore, God created us, in his image and he is Love, truly loving is coming to terms with our own nature; "Love is God; and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God!" "Whoever is without Love does not Know God;"

May God increase our Love for Him and for one another. Amen.

#### COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH CHAPTER THREE The Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic

**CHAPTER ONE** The Dignity of the Human Person

**OUR VOCATION TO BEATITUDE** 

#### **MAN'S FREEDOM**

366. What place does human freedom have in the plan of salvation? 1739-1742. 1748

Our freedom is weakened because of original sin. This weakness is intensified because of successive sins. Christ, however, set us free "so that we should remain free" (Galatians 5:1). With his grace, the Holy Spirit leads us to spiritual freedom to make us free co-workers with him in the Church and in the world.

#### 367. What are the sources of the morality of human acts? 1734-1749-1754, 1757-1758

The morality of human acts depends on three sources: the object chosen, either a true or apparent good; the intention of the subject who acts, that is, the purpose for which the subject performs the act; and the circumstances of the act, which include its consequences.

#### 368. When is an act morally good? 1755-1756, 1759-1760

An act is morally good when it assumes simultaneously the goodness of the object, of the end, and of the circumstances. A chosen object can by itself vitiate an act in its entirety, even if the intention is good. It is not licit to do evil so that good may result from it. An evil end corrupts the action, even if the object is good in itself. On the other hand, a good end does not make an act good if the object of that act is evil, since the end does not justify the means. Circumstances can increase or diminish the responsibility of the one who is acting but they cannot change the moral quality of the acts themselves. They never make good an act which is in itself evil.

#### 369. Are there acts which are always illicit? 1756-1761

There are some acts which, in and of themselves, are always illicit by reason of their object (for example, blasphemy, homicide, adultery). Choosing such acts entails a disorder of the will, that is, a moral evil which can never be justified by appealing to the good effects which could possibly result from them.

#### St. Francois de Laval

Francois de Montmorency Laval (1623-1708) was the first bishop of Quebec City. Born in France to a novel family, he was educated by the Jesuits and ordained in 1647. Despite controversy, he was made bishop in 1658 and arrived in New France the following year. In 1663, he founded the Seminary of Quebec- now Laval Universityto supply priests for his vast diocese, which extended to all the French-speaking territory of North America. He later established a minor seminary and an industrial school. His pastoral concern for the settlers and the Native people often resulted in conflict with civil authorities.

Francois was an outstanding educator and administrator, a generous benefactor, a caring bishop and a pious man whose spiritual influence was widespread. He well deserved his title of "Pere de la Patrie" (Father of the Homeland) and was canonized in 2014 Saint Francois de Laval is the patron of the Bishops of Canada. *Living with Christ, May 2024 edition*
