

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"How can I give you up, O Ephraim! How can I had you over, O Israel! My
Heart recoils within me, my compassion grows warm and tender, I will not
execute my fierce anger, I will not destroy Ephraim; for I am God and not man,
the Holy One in your midst." Hosea 11: 8-9

Last Friday, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus; God's unconditional Love for us, made manifest in his Son's self-giving on the Altar of the Cross.

After his death a soldier pierced through Christ's side and there came out all that was left in His Self-giving; "Blood and Water."

The Heart of God burns with Love for His Creation, from the moment He brought it to being to our times and beyond.

God's master piece of this Creation is us, human beings, created in his own Image. His Love for us equally is without reserve and pursues us in Love and for Love. This is however not the case for man, who many times turns to be self-seeking, blind and runs after the self and God's Created.

At the very beginning an Act in selfishness, in the book of Genesis, separated us from God but He could never give up on us. His concern for us was expressed from the moment we sinned. He came calling; "Adam, where are you?" The response of Adam was; "I heard your sound in the Garden ... and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid."

God's Love for us can never be extinguished by human selfishness!

God begun His Plan motivated by Love, beginning with Abraham and through him Israel. And despite Israel's unfaithfulness, God's Heart burnt with compassion for them; We hear God express Himself in Hosea, "How can I give you up, O Ephraim! How can I had you over, O Israel! My Heart recoils within me, my compassion grows warm and tender, I will not execute my fierce anger, I will not destroy Ephraim; for I am God and not man, the Holy One in your midst. (Hosea 11: 8-9)

God's Compassion and Love overcomes His Justice, Pope Benedict would write.

In the New Testament God revealed His boundless Love, for humanity, by sending his only-begotten Son to take up our Human Nature.

God took upon himself to reconstruct the shattered relationship and reconciled us back to himself through the self-giving of His Son.

We read in John that Jesus knowing that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father, having loved those who were his in the world loved them to the end.

Jesus to manifest His Father's Love for us died on the Cross and Resurrected to confirm His Mission Complete.

He commissioned us to make his Father's Love known in the World. And gave us this Promise; "I am with you always, yes to the end of time."

Blessed are you because you believe. Amen.



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COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH The Fall

73. How should we understand the reality of sin? 385-389

Sin is present in human history. This reality of sin can be understood clearly only in the light of divine revelation and above all in the light of Christ the Savior of all. Where sin abounded, he made grace to abound all the more.

74. What was the fall of the angels? 391-395, 414

This expression indicates that Satan and the other demons, about which Sacred Scripture and the Tradition of the Church speak, were angels, created good by God. They were, however, transformed into evil because with a free and irrevocable choice they rejected God and his Kingdom, thus giving rise to the existence of hell. They try to associate human beings with their revolt against God. However, God has wrought in Christ a sure victory over the Evil One.

75. What was the first human sin? 3396-403, 415-417

When tempted by the devil, the first man and woman allowed trust in their Creator to die in their hearts. In their disobedience they wished to become "like God" but without God and not in accordance with God (Genesis 3:5). Thus, Adam and Eve immediately lost for themselves and for all their descendants the original grace of holiness and justice.

77. What other consequences derive from original sin? 405-409, 418

In consequence of original sin human nature, without being totally corrupted, is wounded in its natural powers. It is subject to ignorance, to suffering, and to the dominion of death and is inclined toward sin. This inclination is called concupiscence.

78. After the first sin, what did God do? 10-412, 420

After the first sin the world was inundated with sin but God did not abandon man to the power of death. Rather, he foretold in a mysterious way in the "Protoevangelium" (Genesis 3:15) that evil would be conquered and that man would be lifted up from his fall. This was the first proclamation of the Messiah and Redeemer. Therefore, the fall would be called in the future a "happy fault" because it "gained for us so great a Redeemer" (Liturgy of the Easter Vigil).


Pope Francis' Prayer Intention - June 2024 - FOR MIGRANTS FLEEING THEIR HOMES

In the New Testament, the promise of living water, the Holy Spirit, is fulfilled in the pierced heart of the Messiah. Our modern understanding of the Sacred Heart of Jesus has been shaped by the visions experienced by St. Margaret Alacoque in the 17th century. In modern times, the image of the Sacred Heart in the home has become a sign that the love of Jesus rules over the family. In 1899 Pope Leo XIII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
