St. Hildegard of Bingen Sep 17th
Pray for us.

"God dwells within all beings, but not all beings are aware of this divine presence."

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"Who do people say that I am?" Mk 8:29

"The Lord God has opened my ear ... The Lord God helps me! ... Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

The first reading of today is taken from the book of Prophet Isaiah and from the third Hymn of the Suffering Servant of the Yahweh. Though a kind of lament, the Prophet manifests his confidence in God. Isaiah was confident because he was aware, first and foremost of the Authority and Majesty, the Glory and Radiance of the One from whom his message originated; "The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue, to know how to give a word of comfort to the weary; morning by morning he makes my ear alert to listen like a disciple!"

Prophet Isaiah trusted in the Lord, even though he was clearly aware that he faced the fate of the Prophets, who were hated, their message ignored, and they themselves mistreated and sometimes killed. His confidence, as a Prophet, his trust in the Lord was founded on his knowledge and experience of God; "I have set my face like a flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame, He who upholds my right arm, … the Lord God is my help."

Jesus, in the Gospel of today, despite the many miracles he had been performing, his majesty was still masked by the ordinariness of his humanity. In St. Mark's Gospel, up to and prior to the reading of today, the only being that declared to know who he was the devil.

In the passage we read in the Gospel reading today, the secret that lay hidden for ages was revealed to Man. Peter, a human being, acknowledged and proclaimed that he was in the presence of God! Mark tells us that Jesus had asked the question to Peter, "on the way," to Jerusalem.

Jesus begun his dialogue, by enquiring about the opinions of the people; "Who do people say that I am?" - The disciple responded, "John the Baptist," "Elijah;" or "One of the Prophets." Then, Jesus asked the most important question; "And you who do you say that I AM?"

"You are the Christ." Peter Responded

In the Gospel of Mathew, Jesus to underline the importance of Peter confession exclaims, "Blessed are you Simon, son of Jonah, for flesh did not reveal this to you but My Heavenly Father."

Jesus ordered the disciples to tell no one that he is the Christ began to teach the disciples of his mission; "the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected ... and be killed and rise after three days." Mk.9:31

It was difficult for the disciples to accept this reality of the Messiah! Peter, even tried to talk Jesus out of his mission. Peter was rebuked strongly; "Go behind me Satan! You are thinking not as God thinks but as human beings do."

True discipleship demanded following the Will of God, the Father. Peter will require the strength and guidance of Holy Spirit to accept the Mission of God; The Cross was inevitable for our Salvation, through Christ Jesus. Accepting this is fundamental for every disciple, for it is fullness of life. May the Lord sustain us in this Faith.

St. Hildegard of Bingen sep 17th

Hildegard was an 11th-century Benedictine mystic and visionary who founded several abbeys, wrote extensively, composed liturgical music, and counted popes and archbishops among her correspondents. In her wri tings Hildegard dedicated herself to explaining divine revelation and making God known in the clarity of his love. Her main writings Hildegard dedicated herself to explaining divine revelation and making God known in the clarity of his love. Her main writings are the *Scivias*, the Liber Vitae Meritorum and the Liber Divinorum Operum. She also wrote botanical treatises and is considered an early pioneer in natural history. Much of her liturgical music survives and is performed to this day. She is widely seen as one of the most important women of the Middle Ages. In 2012 Hildegard was declared a Doctor of the Church, and an optional memorial was added to the universal calendar in 2021. (sources: Vatican.va; Wikipedia)




- Registration for Confirmation is now open for Grade 7 and up, please approach Fr. David after any of the Sunday Mass;


