

"Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate." Mark 10:9

In the Gospel readings we have been hearing, Jesus continued to instruct his Disciples about the secrets of the Kingdom of God, but in today's Gospel, Jesus is interrupted by the Pharisees, whom we are told came to test him.

The Pharisees questioned Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce. They wanted his judgment; "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?"

The Pharisees must have heard that Christ did not approve of divorce and their intention was to get him state this, with the peoples hearing: They hoped to accuse him of contradicting Moses; their great lawgiver. They hoped, that his teaching would turn people against him. Jesus responded to their question with a question; "What did Moses command you?"

They responded by quoting Deut. 24:1-2; "When a man has taken a wife and married her, and it comes to pass that she finds no favor in his eyes, because he has found some indecency in her: Let him write her a bill of divorce, and give it to her and send her out of his house." Moses had advised them to write a certificate of divorce, and in this way put a wife out of a man's house.

Notice that the Pharisees respond with a quote that only favored the rights of a man in a divorce not his wife. Jesus clearly saw through the injustice.

Jesus conceded that Moses indeed, had allowed the certificate of divorce that enabled a man to send his wife away. However, he reminded them, that this was not God's original plan. It had crept into their tradition, through Moses, because "of the Hardness of the Hearts" of the people of Israel, whom the Pharisees represented.

God's original Creative Plan was to be found in his action "from the beginning of creation." And from that original point, God made them man and woman; and Jesus quoted Genesis; "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one."

In the Genesis, the woman was a gift of God to the Man and the man was a gift of God to woman. In the 1st Reading we heard, Adam acknowledged this; Listen to what he said when he awoke and saw Eve; "This at last, is bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called "Woman." for out of Man this one was taken."

It is God who established the Union "from the beginning". And Jesus argues, it is not the right of any human being to tear that union apart; "*Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.*" It is not the command of Moses but the will of God!

The Pharisees disappear and Jesus was left with his Disciples. In the house, the disciples enquire about the teaching they had listened to. And they question Jesus about the same issue! Jesus, however addresses a different question; The aftermath of Divorce!

Jesus addresses the Injustice to the Woman! Found in Verses 3 & 4 of Deut. 24;

And when she has departed out of his house, she may go and be another man's wife. ... And if the latter husband hates her, and he writes her a bill of divorce ... her former husband, ... must not take her back again to be his wife, for she is defiled.

Jesus underlines that in the sin of infidelity, it is not only the woman who sins against her husband when she breaks the commandment as their Tradition taught!

The Man too sins against his wife when he breaks the commandment.

This Teaching does not sit well even with the Disciples; In the House they Complained to Jesus; "If that is how things are between husband and wife, it is advisable not to marry."

To which Jesus responded, "It is not everyone who can accept what I have said but only those to whom it is granted."

COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Section One

"I believe" - "We believe"

1. What is the plan of God for man? 1-25 God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent his Son as the Redeemer and Savior of mankind, fallen into sin, thus calling all into his Church and, through the work of the Holy Spirit, making them adopted children and heirs of his eternal happiness.

CHAPTER ONE

Man's Capacity for God

- 2. Why does man have a desire for God? 27-30, 44-45 God himself, in creating man in his own image, has written upon his heart the desire to see him. Even if this desire is often ignored, God never ceases to draw man to himself because only in God will he find and live the fullness of truth and happiness for which he never stops searching. By nature, and by vocation, therefore, man is a religious being, capable of entering into communion with God. This intimate and vital bond with God confers on man his fundamental dignity.
- 3. How is it possible to know God with only the light of human reason? 31-36, 46-47 Starting from creation, that is from the world and from the human person, through reason alone one can know God with certainty as the origin and end of the universe, as the highest good and as infinite truth and beauty.
- **4.** Is the light of reason alone sufficient to know the mystery of God? 37-43, 48-49 In coming to a knowledge of God by the light of reason alone man experiences many difficulties. Indeed, on his own he is unable to enter into the intimacy of the divine mystery. This is why he stands in need of being enlightened by God's revelation, not only about those things that exceed his understanding, but also about those religious and moral truths which of themselves are not beyond the grasp of human reason, so that even in the present condition of the human race, they can be known by all with ease, with firm certainty and with no admixture of error.

St. Bruno Oct 6th

Bruno, founder of the Carthusian Order, was born in Cologne, Germany, about 1030. He studied at Rheims and was invited back to tach theology and grammar. During his 18 years at Rheims the taught many eminent scholars and was chancellor of the diocese. When the archbishop died in 1068, his replacement was highly unsuitable and the objections of Bruno and other canons were met with persecution, which forced them to flee the city. Eventually that archbishop was deposed.

Clerical corruption left Bruno wanting to live a contemplative life. In 1080 he gave up his riches and, with six companions, began to live as a hermit. In 1084, the group was granted land in the Chartreuse Mountains. This was the beginning of the Carthusian Order and of the great abbey that is its motherhouse.

In recognition of this great learning, Bruno was called to Rome in 1090 to assist the pope, a former pupil. It was soon obvious that Bruno was not suited to court life and he was permitted to found a second monastery in Calabria, close enough to be available to the Holy See. He died there in 1101, leaving no rule, but a spirit of prayerful simplicity, which lives on. Living with Christ, Oct 2024 edition

Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (your personal intention)


