ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

(June 24th)

Pray for us.

"I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" Matthew.3:14



"Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers and cast out demons." (Mt. 10:8)

Happy Fathers' Day to all dads today. We dedicate you all to the Lord. May He bless you exceedingly according to his will. Indeed, when God, the Father, sent His Son Jesus into the World to save us, He entrusted him to an Earthly Father; St Joseph; Who was exemplary, obedient, and generous.

Fatherhood is a Vocation, Pope Francis would write; For men to exist, and are complete and mature, they are to feel the joy of Fatherhood. When a man does not have this desire, something is missing in that it is like incomplete life. The Pope gave St. Joseph as the model to all Fathers; His great Mission was to be a Guardian.

We pray for all Fathers.

In the first reading, this Sunday, God leads the People of Israel, as a Father, to the foot of Mt. Sinai. He was to constitute them, there, as a People and a Nation, with Him as their King. The Author of the Genesis, reveals to us that they were in the wilderness of sin. If they were to remain faithful, they were to keep their memories alive, in the deeds that the Lord had so far done for them; "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel: You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on the eagles' wings and brought you to myself!"

If the Israelites remained faithful to the Covenant, they were about to make with the Lord, God promised that they would be his "treasured possession."

Israel, however, failed the Lord, miserably but He did not give up on them; He had a Mission to complete!

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus, the fulfillment of the Promise of the Father, sympathizes with his people; they were "harassed and helpless."

He sets out to inaugurate the new Israel by choosing his Apostles according to the number of the twelve tribes of Israel. He sends them to proclaim the Kingdom and console his People; "Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers and cast out demons."

Brothers and sisters, the love and concern of God, for us is unquestionable. He longs for us and pursues us because we are his sons and daughters. St Paul in the 2nd reading, reminds us, that God did this even when we were unfaithful; while we were still sinners Christ died for us. Let us respond to the beaconing of Our Heavenly Father, with even great generosity.





COMPENDIUM OF THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

271. What is the Eucharist? 1322-1323;1409

The Eucharist is the very sacrifice of the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus which he instituted to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until his return in glory. Thus, he entrusted to his Church this memorial of his death and Resurrection. It is a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet, in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.

272. When did Jesus Christ institute the Eucharist? 1323;1337-1340

Jesus instituted the Eucharist on Holy Thursday "the night on which he was betrayed" (1 Corinthians 11:23), as he celebrated the Last Supper with his apostles.

273. How did he institute the Eucharist? 1337-1340;1365,1406 After he had gathered with his apostles in the Cenacle, Jesus took bread in his hands. He broke it and gave it to them saying, "Take this and eat it, all of you; this is my Body which will be given up for you". Then, he took the cup of wine in his hands and said, "Take this and drink of this, all of you. This is the cup of my Blood, the Blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgive. Do this in memory of me".

274. What does the Eucharist represent in the life of the Church?

It is the source and summit of all Christian life. In the Eucharist, the sanctifying action of God in our regard and our worship of him reach their high point. It contains the whole spiritual good of the Church, Christ himself, our Pasch. Communion with divine life and the unity of the People of God are both expressed and effected by the Eucharist. Through the eucharistic celebration we are united already with the liturgy of heaven and we have a foretaste of eternal life.

275. What are the names for this sacrament? 1328-1332

The unfathomable richness of this sacrament is expressed in different names which evoke its various aspects. The most common names are: the Eucharist, Holy Mass, the Lord's Supper, the Breaking of the Bread, the Eucharistic Celebration, the Memorial of the passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord, the Holy Sacrifice, the Holy and Divine Liturgy, the Sacred Mysteries, the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar, and Holy Communion.

St. John the Baptist, June 24th

John the Baptist was a contemporary of Christ who was known for evangelization and his baptizing of Jesus Christ.

John the Baptist was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children. According to scriptures, the Angel Gabriel visited Elizabeth and Zachariah to tell them they would have a son and that they should name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and fo this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born and named John, in fulfillment of God's will.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God.

John began public ministry around 30AD, and was known for attracting large crowds across the province of Judaea and around the Jordan River. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you."

Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, which he did, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
